February 13th - pre-game activities start and this year include Tennis, Horseshoes Singles and Duplicate Bridge.

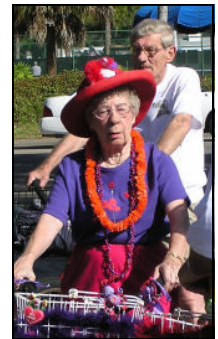
February 18th - the Games will begin, and will run

When Hal Scott introduced the idea of an Olympic type competition for the residents of our park 11 years ago, nobody could have predicted how it would mushroom to become the event of the year.

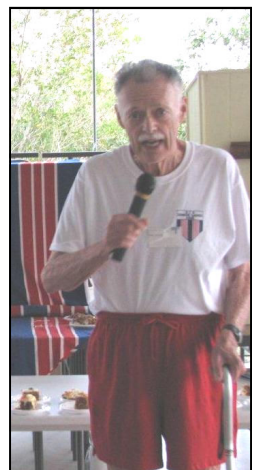

Such were the words heard at least 80 times at the Fun Auction on January 14. Residents were lined up way before 8 a.m. to enter their items for sale.

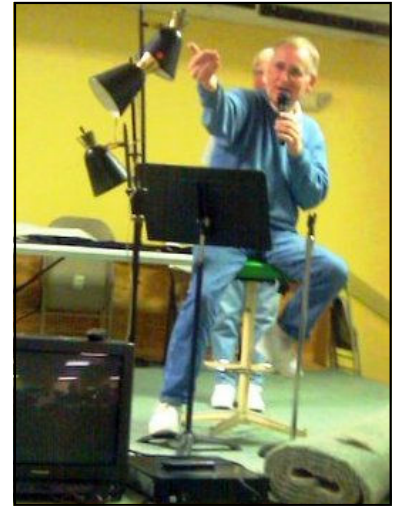
Dave Jones and his crew tried to hold the items to no more than 75, but it happened that 88 items were accepted before residents and their items were turned away at 8:45.

Among the items generating the highest bids were a three wheel bicycle for \$105, a compressor for \$97, a 15 speed bicycle for \$71, a wicker coffee table for \$61, a jelly cabinet for \$55, a compact refrigerator for \$50.

Residents purchased the rest of the bargains ranging

from \$1 to \$40 including vacuum cleaners, golf clubs, chairs, lamps, pictures, telephones, heaters, etc. etc, etc.

## More...News Around the Park

### Pine Beetles attack park trees

Some of us returned this fall to an unpleasant surprise – a number of our beautiful slash pines were cut down this summer and fall. The reason: pine beetles. There are several species of pine beetles active in Florida. The most likely culprit working here is the southern pine beetle.



There is no real effective control of the pine beetles, and when conditions are right, they colonize and destroy huge numbers of trees. If you have traveled in the northeast or Colorado, you may have seen hundreds of acres of dead pines on the mountainsides.

The attacked trees seem to die very suddenly – sometimes within a week or so. They have probably been under attack for a longer time, but finally reached crisis stage and turned brown quickly.

The beetles are not the cause of death for the trees. The beetles attack aging, diseased, dense or drought-stricken trees. They accelerate the death of already distressed trees. The local extension office, and Master Gar-

dener Elaine Pardey, say the recommended response to pine beetle infestation is to remove dead trees immediately. If dead trees are allowed to remain, the beetles will move from one to the next.

There are currently several trees in the park awaiting removal. It is important that you inspect your trees, and notify the office immediately if you see your pine trees turning brown. Jason and the maintenance staff are keeping a close eye on the number of trees affected.
