

SPRING FLOOD OUTLOOK FOR WEST CENTRAL AND SOUTHWEST FLORIDA.....LOW FLOOD THREAT FOR THE NEXT SEVERAL MONTHS... The Florida dry season has lived up to its name and then some. Very dry warm conditions have occurred during the fall and winter months across all of west central and southwest Florida. Rainfall deficits have run 4 to 8 inches across the region.

Sounds like we are going to continue for several months in this dry period, so please be careful with all campfires.

I know this was in the March Macaw but it is very important. If you are leaving us in April, make sure all outside items around your site are put inside your shed, your lanai or your park model or RV. Please leave **NOTHING** outside that might become a projectile in a wind storm. Please put tables on paved surfaces, if you need help ask a neighbor or call the office.

Reminders:

- Pile pick up Monday 400's & 500's; Tuesday 200's; Wednesday 300's; Thursday RV section & 600's
- Please keep pine needles separate from other yard debris. Please remember as everyone returns and rakes, I will schedule additional pick-ups as needed.
- If you would like late access to the Club House, Rec Hall, Card Room, and Lounge area, please remember to call 941.400.3134 to make arrangements in advance.



This season is coming to a close and I am sure some have already left the park. This season was a pleasant departure from the last two, much quieter and conflict free, and the weather was great. We are lucky enough to spend the winters in one of the best parks in Florida. A refrain that I constantly hear is that visitors and newcomers are amazed at the number of activities. We know that if it were not for the volunteers that would not be so. The park was full in January and February and, once again, they have an extensive list of standbys for next season. This is a jewel in Encore's system.

The Annual General Meeting was held February 11. The park manager, Beverly Malouin, told us about a number of major projects she has planned for this year, including road paving and new Pickleball courts, and the need to attend to that pesky Transient Use Agreement. This year's paving is the start of a three-year paving project. We also elected two board members to fill spots becoming vacant; Don Silke and Linda Lewis and re-elected



Chuck Genrich. I want to thank Patty Hicks and Maddy Trimby for their service to the park during their time on the board. I was heartened by the fact that during the comment period there were very few issues. I am hoping that means a contented population. At our regular February meeting the new slate of officers was voted in resulting in Chuck Genrich as president, Terry Ludban, vice president, Linda Lewis, secretary and Bruce Hummel, treasurer.

The board has responded to several funding requests this season. The pancake breakfast has purchased two new grills, one of which was paid for from the Activity Fund. That fund also provided additional fencing for the Pickleball courts, \$500 to the choir and one half of the cost of a new keyboard for Bill Primeau. The other half of the keyboard cost was contributed by Canada Day. The board remains receptive to funds requests but everyone needs to keep in mind that the board currently receives very little to replenish the Activity Fund. While we receive funds from the pancake breakfast we also provide the funds they use to buy their supplies which results in small positive cash return.

The Advisory Board website (royalcoachmanresort.net) has undergone some revisions and updates. You will note that, at the request of the park, we have gotten rid of the dreaded word Association. The unit rental and sales link has been removed to take a significant workload off of the webmaster.

Finally, on that web site are the photos, names, site number and email addresses of the Advisory Board. You can contact any one of them with any issue. Our mission is to be your voice to Park Management. To end, personally, I look forward to next season at a great park with outstanding guests.

- Air Pump Air for vehicle tires is located at the back of the Resort, at the Dump Station. We do not supply a gauge.
- © Bulletin Board Any notices to be posted must be brought to the Office. Please use a 3"x5" index card to list items for sale/rent. All other notices must be appropriate size. Bulletin boards are located throughout the Boardwalk and at the Recreation hall and Clubhouse.
- © Campfires No Ground Fires are permitted. Above the ground covered fire containers are permitted. If it is an extremely dry season, the Office will post notices regarding campfires
- © Canoes They are available at no cost. They are located across from site 67 on the Outer Circle. To sign out canoes bring your driver's license to the Office. We will hold your license for you to pick up after returning the canoe. Paddles and life jackets are available in the locked shed by the canoes. You must be 18-years-old or older or accompanied by a parent to use the canoes. There is a 2-hour limit for usage and they are available from 9:00 a.m. - 4:30 p.m. daily.
- Kayak Racks To utilize the kayak racks you must sign a contract at the office and lock your kayak on the assigned spot. Any canoes/kayaks found unaccounted for may be disposed of.
- Laundry Room Located at the Clubhouse. No cash accepted. Credit/Debit card required for use. Small load \$1.50 Medium Load \$1.75 Large Load \$2.00
- © Car & Boat Wash There is a car, RV and boat wash located by the Maintenance Shop, available on a first-come, first-serve basis
- Dump Station An RV Dump Station is located in the back of the Resort near the Maintenance Shed.
- © Emergency Shelter Information Please check the Bulletin Boards on the Boardwalk and Clubhouse, or our Facebook page for Sarasota County Emergency Shelter Locations. There is an evacuation plan for viewing available at the Office.
- © Faxes and Copies The Office will fax your document(s) with a cost of \$1.50 for the first page and \$.50 for each additional page. Please notify the Office if you will be receiving a fax. Incoming faxes are \$.15 per page. Copies are \$.15 per page for black and white. We will not make color copies.
- Fitness Center The Fitness Center is located on the Boardwalk. You must be 18-years-old or older to use the center. The entry code is with your arrival documents.
- Garbage and Recycling Center The garbage compactor and recycling containers are located at the back of the Clubhouse. We recycle cardboard, newspaper, plastic jugs and clear plastic bottles and glass. Plastic bags do not go into the recycling containers. Please break down all boxes and follow posted directions for the disposal of trash. This area is only for trash; not furniture, appliances, tires, batteries, etc. For large items, etc. you can take them directly to the Sarasota County Landfill. It is located at 4000 Knights Trail Rd., Nokomis 34275. Call for their daily hours 941-861-1573.
- Ice It is available at the Office during business hours for the cost of \$2 for a 10-pound bag.
- Internet Café Located on the Boardwalk. A computer is available to use or bring your laptop for complimentary Wi-Fi. Entry codes are in your welcome packet.
- Mailroom Please verify that your site # is on your incoming mail to prevent any delays. Also, please make sure that your name is listed on the mail; if a package/letter is addressed to Grandma/Grandpa/Pet's name/Etc., your mail may not be delivered. As a courtesy, we do our very best to deliver the mail promptly. Should you desire to **Nokomis Post Office** obtain your mail at the local post office, the information needed is: Laurel Rd., Nokomis, FL

Rates at the Nokomis Post Office vary from \$17 for 3-months to \$400 for 12-months, variable by the size of your box. Caller service is also available.

- Pavilion The pavilion is a large covered area that is available for picnics, parties, etc. for big groups of our guests. Electricity is available. Sign up on the Blue ONE-TIME ACTIVITIES sheet in the Lounge and give it to the Activities Director.
- Paws Park Pets are welcome, but ALL cats and dogs must be leashed at all times when outside of the Paws Park. Owners MUST pick up after their pets. No pets should be left unattended or tied up outside. No fences or playpens allowed. Pets are not permitted in activity buildings (i.e. Clubhouse, Rec Hall, etc.) pool area or in the bathrooms/showers. Paws Park is open from 8 a.m. - 10 p.m. daily and is located behind the car wash. Pets should not be an annoyance – i.e. "Excessive barking" and unleashed.
- Sports Equipment Basketballs, volleyballs, golf clubs, etc. are available at the Office.

Pub 32 provides a unique opportunity to visit Ireland without ever leaving Sarasota. The food is wonderful,

the Sunday evening music rousing, the setting just right for a pub while comfortable for non-bar goers, and a perfect place for lunch after tennis or a round of golf. Sunday night's Irish music jam sessions, which include park residents Holly and Tim, provide a lively evening's entertainment: attendees sing along to well known songs and sway in unison to others. Reservations are crucial for Sunday; there isn't an

empty seat in the place. Large parties are accommodated with ease. If you're a "two-top" or a party of four, request a seat near the music; be specific if you don't want a room-like booth (blocks view of music) or to be seated behind a wall. Make reservations as far in advance as you can to guarantee a good table.

The menu is varied, one can enjoy a sandwich or a gourmet meal; I don't think you can go wrong in your meal choice. Many appetizers are made to be shared: freshly cut potato chips with Lager and Dubliner Irish cheddar dip, an Irish inspired O'Poutine which consists of crispy corned beef, Super Gravy (beef gravy supplemented with beef reduction), and Irish Cheddar cheese over homemade chips (not French fries). Other appetizers to share include crunchy, crisp curried chickpeas, and a "Pickle Plate" of assorted house made pickles, Irish oat bread and Irish butter. While the Pub offers two salads, let's face it, who goes to a

pub for a salad? Bubble & Squeak, Smoked Marrow Bones with bitter greens, Bushmills Liver Pate, and Garlic Cheddar soup are among the other choices.

The "All Day" menu has more casual choices: sandwiches, stews, and other more Irish homey dishes. The Reuben is hand sliced Guinness corned beef, still crunchy red cabbage that provided a balance of textures, grilled with Swiss cheese on rye bread; not one scintilla of sogginess make this an elevated deli classic. Fish and Chips is pub perfection on a plate: a crunchy, light batter keeps the fish moist and lightly cooked inside, hand cut fries, curry tartar sauce, and outrageously good slaw. The Cheeseburger is eight ounces of ground chuck & short rib meat, rich with flavor, and so far, I've not seen anyone finish a whole one. 

BETTY'S CORNER – THE GREAT BLUE HERON

Common near the shores of open water and in wetlands over most of North America and Central America you will find the Great Blue Heron, a large wading bird in the heron family. It is the largest North American heron with a wingspan of 66 - 79 inches. Great Blue Herons are about twice as heavy as Great Egrets. The males' average weight is 5.5 lbs with females' slightly less at 4.7 lbs.



Graceful on land

and in air, their appearance is striking. Notable features include slate gray with a slight azure blue tint flight feathers, red-brown thighs, and a paired red-brown and black stripe up the flanks; the neck is rusty-gray, with black and white streaking down the front; the head is paler, with nearly white face, and a pair of black or slate neck plumes run from just above the eye to the

back of the head. The feathers on the lower neck are long and plume-like; it also has plumes on the lower back at the start of breeding season.

Interesting Facts Include:

- Primary food is small fish though occasionally known to eat shrimp, crabs, aquatic insects, rodents and other small mammals, reptiles and birds
- Usually forage while standing in water they are large wading birds which can feed in deeper water giving them an advantage over other wading birds but they prefer the shallow water



- Usually breed in colonies and are usually only monogamous for one season
- Both females and males incubate the eggs and both feed chicks by regurgitating food
- In Florida, young herons take their first flight at about 80 days and return to the nest to be fed for about another 3 weeks
- Predators of eggs and nestlings include turkey vultures, common ravens, crows, hawks, black bear, raccoons; larger avian predators such as eagles are the only known predator to attack great blue herons at every stage of their lifecycle.

John and I had the privilege of watching and photographing the ritual of the male courting his chosen female by showing her the nest and dancing with the beautiful mating plumes along his lower back extended. When you see a great blue heron, be sure to take some time to watch the patience displayed during the hunt and the lovely takeoff and flight when they decide to head for their nest. What a blessing to have the opportunity to observe these creatures up close and personal.
